Council Proceedings for the City of Kennett, Missouri October 21, 2025 6:30 p.m.

The City Council of the City of Kennett, Missouri met in regular session at 6:30 p.m. at City Hall on Tuesday, October 21, 2025.

Those in attendance were Mayor Jake Crafton, Council members Lisa Dry, Randy Carter, Mark Bryant, Harry Gaddis, Dennis Pelts, Steve Panousis, Jimmy French and Bob Young; City Administrator Steve Rasmussen, City Attorney Terry McVey and City Clerk Jan McElwrath. Council member Kevin Swain was absent.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Jake Crafton.

Pastor Mark Kailbourn gave the invocation.

Council member Dennis Pelts led the Pledge of Allegiance.

A motion to approve the minutes of the regular meeting of October 7, 2025, was made by Council member Lisa Dry, seconded by Council member Mark Bryant; motion passed.

Mr. Panousis moved to accept the September Statement of Revenue and Expenditures, second by Mr. Carter; motion passed.

A motion to accept the September Abstract of Accounts was made by Mr. Panousis, second by Mr. Bryant; motion passed.

City Administrator's Report:

Mr. Rasmussen recognized Kennett Board of Public CEO Jamie Chitester to update the Council regarding the sanitation services beginning November 1, 2025. Mr. Chitester reported that, per City Ordinance, there is no limit on the number of trash bins that residents may have. The monthly charge for bins is \$18.95, with a charge of \$10.00 each for additional bins. If people do not order extra cans at the initial time of delivery, there may be a service charge to deliver the extra trash bins. Mr. Chitester also stated that during Thanksgiving and Christmas KBPW will pick up extra trash for one week following these holidays as long as that trash is bagged.

Kennett Chamber of Commerce Executive Director Christian Johnson reported that September is the busiest month for tourism. The Kennett Cruisers Car Show and Fall into Arts were approved for \$1,500 each for tourism marketing and both organizations have submitted proof of their expenses as required by the Tourism Committee.

The annual Chamber holiday open house for local businesses will be November 8-9, 2025. People visiting participating businesses will receive a ticket which will be entered into a drawing for a gift basket containing items from those businesses.

Mr. Johnson stated that Small Business Saturday is November 29 and encouraged everyone to shop locally in support of local businesses. The Small Town Christmas activities sponsored by the Adelphian Club will begin Saturday, December 9, with the annual Adelphian Christmas Bazaar. The festival of trees and a Sunday matinee will be December 10; a to-be-announced event at the Bistro will be held on Monday, December 11, with the Small Town Christmas event downtown on Tuesday, December 12.

Mr. Johnson requested to allocate \$1,500 from from the Tourism Marketing fund to the Adelphian Club. Motion to do so was made by Mr. Pelts, second by Mr. Bryant; motion passed.

Old business:

A rental property update was given Fire Chief Lance Davis. Chief Davis reported that Mr. Riley Cook continues to make progress on the repairs of his rental properties as required by the Council in order to keep his business license.

Chief Davis stated that regarding telephone calls to the Fire Administration office, since inspectors and fire administration staff are out of the office many times, the Rental Inspector can be reached at 573-559-6029; Code Enforcement at 573-344-2289; general inquiries should use 573-888-3005 where callers will be provided with a directory; and for fire department calls, 573-888-5337.

Police Chief Kenny Wilson explained Resolution 2025-5 presented to the Council to purchase laptop computers as previously discussed. The Kennett Police Department was approved for a Blue Shield grant for \$50,000. The Blue Shield grant coordinator encouraged Chief Wilson to apply for the full amount, with a possibility of receiving an amount slightly over \$50,000, so he applied for \$50,565.50 to purchase 10 laptops and 3 handheld computers. Mr. Carter moved to approve Resolution 2025-5, second by Mr. Bryant; motion passed.

Mr. Carter reported that a few weeks ago the City published a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for storm water and for general engineering services. The Street and Finance committees interviewed representatives from 5 engineering firms. As a point of information, Mr. Carter stated that the firms selected were Horner-Shifrin, general engineering for street work and other engineering services that may be needed, and Waters & Associates for storm water engineering services. There are no contracts at this time, but these will be the first firms that the City will approach as needed.

New business:

Mr. Rasmussen introduced Resolution 2025-6 concerning the new sidewalks on Floyd Street. Mayor Crafton questioned that lighting was not included. After discussion, a motion to table approval of Resolution 2025-6 was made by Mr. Pelts, seconded by Mr. Bryant; motion passed.

Public Comments:

Mr. Dewayne Cooper, a roofing contractor from Paragould, Arkansas, suggested an improved permitting and inspection process for roofing contractors.

Being no further business, the meeting was adjourned to go to closed session.
